



College Bowl Rules



College Bowl was a game show on television that was wildly popular in the 1960s. Allen Ludden was the original host, who may have been more famous for marrying Betty White (they met on the set of the second game show Ludden hosted, Password).

College Bowl is a competition of knowledge between two teams. The winning team must be able to recall important information quickly and accurately.

We're going to test your knowledge of Jump Start Policy and Practice with a challenging round of College Bowl.

Here are the rules:

- 1) Each round starts with a Toss-Up question worth 10 points. All teams will be given a class bell to ring when they think they know the answer to the Toss-Up question.

The moderator will stop reading the question when a team rings in – that team will have ten seconds to answer. If they don't answer correctly, the moderator will continue reading the question until a team rings in and answers correctly. The team offering the correct answer will receive the 10 points. (There is no penalty for an incorrect answer.)

- 2) We will divide our Academy cohort into nine 4-person teams. We will make sure each team is a mix of people, both in terms of experience and location. *Three teams at a time will be selected to answer each Toss-Up question.*

- 3) The team correctly answering a Toss-Up question will then have the first opportunity to answer the associated Bonus question for full value. *But all teams will have the opportunity to answer the Bonus question for half value.* (Judges around the room will help the moderator make the determination of whether or not a team should get credit for their Bonus question answers.)

- 4) We will take the time to discuss answers that may be unknown to most in the cohort. While we're here to have fun, we're mostly here to learn. We'll take the time to make sure we're all learning. *And anyone who finds an error in one of the answers offered by the moderator will earn his / her team an extra 20 points.*

- 5) The team with the most points at the end of the competition will be crowned the CTE Leadership Academy College Bowl Champion, winning an appropriate reward.
